The Model is delighted to present Turbulence, a new exhibition featuring the work of several important contemporary Irish and international artists, from Sat. 22 Dec. 2017 to Sun. 22 Apr. 2018.

Turbulence looks at the way in which contemporary artists, such as Rossella Biscotti (IT), Elaine Hoey (IE), Gülsün Karamustafa (TR), Naiza Khan (UK/PK), Eoin McHugh (IE), Cengiz Tekin (TR) and Sarah Wood (UK), are responding to the migrancy crisis facing today's world. The exhibition will also feature key works by Jack Yeats drawn from the collection of The National Gallery of Ireland, Sligo's Municipal Niland Collection as well as from a number of prestigious private collections.

This major exhibition takes place across all seven galleries at The Model, and considers the freedom of movement - and the lack thereof - of many people in today's world. The exhibition will explore the way in which politics, power and the movement of people have historically shaped our world, and will consider contemporary concerns around post-colonialism, socio-politics, hospitality and humanity.

Speaking about the new exhibition The Model's Acting Director Emer McGarry said "This exhibition is inspired by a small group of allegorical paintings created by Jack Yeats in the direct aftermath of WWII. In these paintings Yeats explored his concern regarding the mass displacement of people that followed the war. Turbulence looks at the way in which displacement and enforced migrancy is still a major concern to artists working today".

Turbulence will open on Sat. 02 Dec. at 4pm with a drinks reception and tapas by Sligo Global Kitchen followed by opening remarks and a performance with Donal O' Kelly. To mark the exhibition, a major symposium will take place in Spring 2018. Turbulence will also be accompanied by specially curated programme of complimentary exhibitions. Each of these three exhibitions in The Model's process room will explore divergent ideas around movement and travel in the contemporary world and will feature artists Martin Creed (UK), Peter Wachtler (DE), Joana Hadjithomas & Khalil Joreige (LB). Gülsün Karamustafa is a Turkish artist based in Istanbul. In 1969, she earned a Master of Fine Arts degree in painting from the Academy of Fine Arts, Istanbul. She has had solo exhibitions in Museum für Gegenwart and has taken part in-group shows at the Tate Modern, Momentum, Berlin and Museum of Contemporary Art, Chicago.

Rossella Biscotti is an Italian visual artist based in Amsterdam. She is a graduate of the Accademie di Belle Arti, Naples and Rijksakademie van Beeldende Kunsten, Amsterdam. She has had solo exhibitions in Columbia University, New York and has taken part in-group shows at the institute for Contemporary Arts, London, Hong Kong Whistleblowers Club, Para Site, Hong Kong and The Third Tiger, Radioartemobile Rome.

Elaine Hoey

Elaine Hoey is an Irish New Media Artist, based in Dublin. She graduated from NCAD with a BA and MFA in Fine Art Media. In 2016, Hoey was the recipient of the Taylor Art Award. She has shown at MoMA, the Science Gallery and the National College of Art and Design.
