Thirty Miami Bus Shelters Sprinkled with Work by Anya Kielar



For a month, Locust Projects will exhibit the third annual Out of the Box Project, OOTB with a new public art project "Yellow Lines" by Brooklyn-based artist Anya Kielar.

Two years ago, Locust Projects embarked in an unconventional art promotion in the form of advertising with contemporary artists exhibiting their works in billboards, bus backs and this year through Miami Beach and Design District bus shelters.

Yellow Lines, is a "sprayogram" resembling a clothesline displaying dismembered apparel with rows of lace gloves, jewelry, stockings, in eerie yellow, white and black colors creating a theatrical environment to be exhibited on over 30 bus shelters.

Kielar's work draws upon sources including set design, surrealist collage, post-minimalist sculpture, and decorative arts, while joining varied objects and textures.
