The Book: Harvard Square, André Aciman's third novel, follows an Egyptian student at Cambridge's most famous institute of higher education as he befriends a cab driver and finds there's more to an American life than he might have thought. Out Monday, April 8, 2013.

The Album: British post-dubstep sensation James Blake is back. The 24-year-old, Mercury Prize-nominated musician's sophomore album, Overgrown, delivers another dose of the moody electronica that made his debut one of last year's most lauded records. Out Tuesday, April 9, 2013.
